Dear parents and carers,

What an amazing year this is turning out to be – a bank holiday and warm sunny weather is almost unheard of. Some great things have also been happening at school and it is always wonderful to show parents and visitors round our school and to receive such positive and encouraging feedback about the high standard of work, the warm and friendly atmosphere and such polite and considerate children. We have so much to be thankful for at Cawood and so much we can celebrate. We do all that we can to maintain the highest levels of education. All the staff have worked incredibly hard to prepare the children for the Sats so that they can achieve all that they are capable of.

I felt that the Spring term finished really well, with Parent's Evening and then the Easter service at All Saints Church. Thank you for all the supportive comments which are always welcome. We also appreciate that from time to time there may be questions or concerns about something. Please do not hesitate to talk with a member of staff as we are always happy to help and sort out any problem or difficulty that may arise. If you do wish to see your child's teacher then it is better to catch them after school as we are usually very busy in the morning getting things ready and putting the finishing touches to the day. Please also call the school office if you wish to arrange a meeting.

It has been great this term to welcome Mrs Booth onto the staff team. She has fitted in so well and has been brilliant, working with Mrs Tomsett and often coming in on her days off to get to know the children and the school better.

Mrs Booth brings to school her great desire for all children to do well and a real passion to see children enjoy learning and develop their own individual skills and talents. She has a wealth of experience including working for Hull University on behaviour support management.

Mrs Booth is teaching on a Monday and Tuesday and Mrs Tomsett is teaching on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

We had a good training day on April 16th. The day started with a look at the school data and what it is telling us. We also looked at the new ASP (Analyse School Performance) document which replaced the Raiseonline. Although it was not the most exciting start to the day it was very useful. After this we looked at our *Global Values, British Values* and *Christian Values*. This was very interesting and worthwhile bringing three important aspects of our ethos and values to the forefront of our minds. Clearly, it reminds us all that our children are at the very centre of all that we do and that we value every child as an individual who has particular gifts, strengths, creativity and a unique personality. Our ambition is that we see all children flourish and succeed.

Our training day on Monday September 3rd is to take another look at our vision and ethos. Does the vision that we have encompass *Global Values, British Values* and *Christian Values*? How can we make our school even better? We would like to know your views and the views of the governors, the staff, the church and the local community. We will send out questionnaires towards the end of the year.

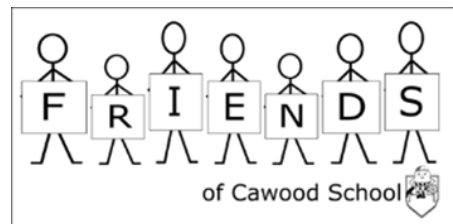

The date of the Summer fair is Saturday June 30th.



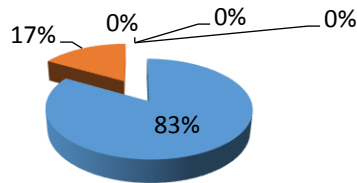

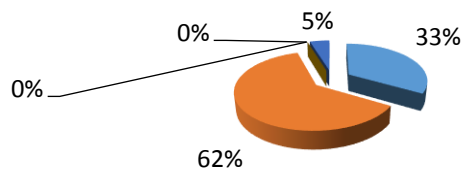


Key Stage 1

Dear parents and carers,

I am well known at school as a governor and teaching member of staff with a specialism for helping and supporting all children in school across the age ranges. I am very dedicated to helping all children in school, and particularly supporting children who may have anxieties, worries or may be displaying signs of developing an issue which can arise from a variety of situations faced both at home and school. My role is to offer support and work through matters with children, staff and parents. I feel that this is an essential role in school as I can, if needed, provide a link between school and the home for parents or carers with general school welfare matters.

I will continue running sessions throughout the week for parents, carers and children. These sessions are an opportunity for you to come and talk things over. If your child is experiencing anything at home that may be impacting on school life, or you have any concerns regarding the wellbeing of your child in the school environment I would invite you to come and see me.

Sessions can work on a casual 'drop in' one to one basis, but I will be available from 8.15am if you wish to make an appointment to see me. Alternatively, I will be available at the start and the end of the school day if you wish to catch me for a quick chat and make an appointment for a longer meeting.
